The main purpose of the conference is to identify and remedy cross-border VAT issues in a pan-European, as well as global, context. Placing the European VAT system in the centre of the discussion, the goal of the conference is to collect evidence of both double taxation and double non-taxation situations. In particular, the conference will focus on double (non) taxation in cross border intra-Community trade (trade between EU countries) and cross border "extra-Community trade" (trade between EU and third countries), caused by, or enabled through, disparities in the VAT and GST systems that are currently in place in most countries in the world. The conference will also examine measures that have already been taken and what measures are still to be taken in order to prevent double (non)taxation.
